attractive Museum of the Jadar Region and land marking monument to Jovan Cvijić).

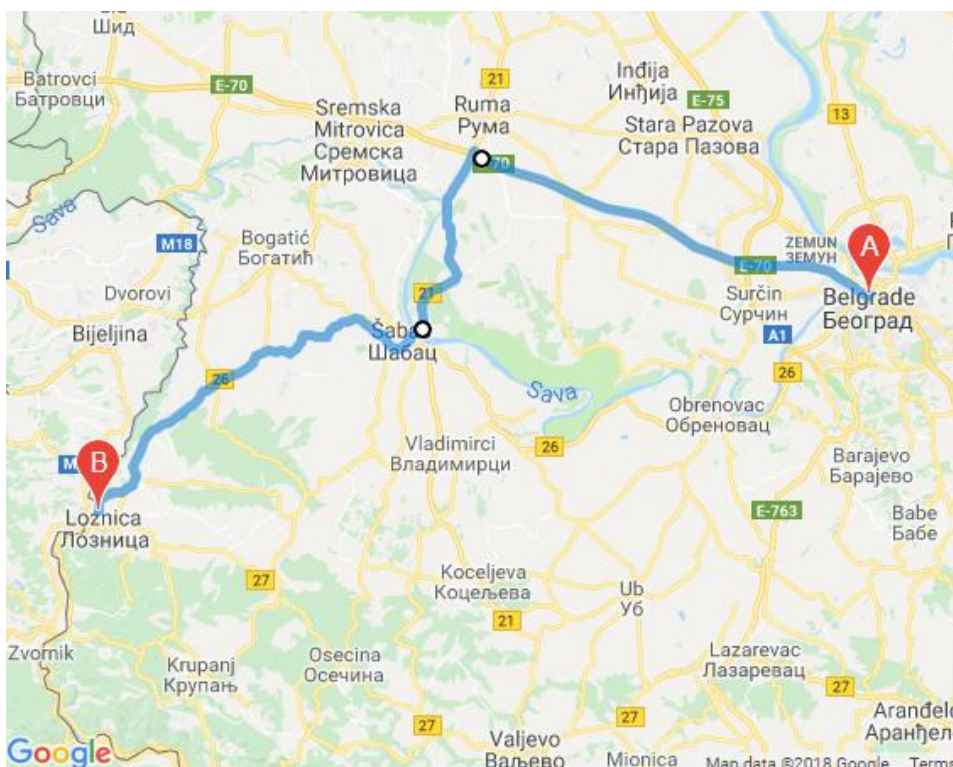

How to get to Tršić (Loznica)

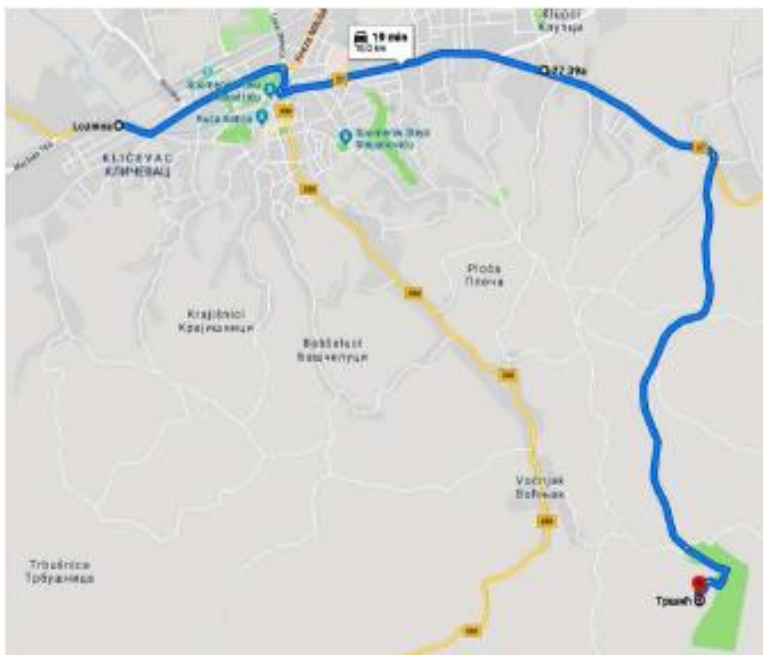
A small settlement Tršić is located 8 km from Loznica. There are several possibilities to reach the Educational and Cultural Centre “Vuk Karadžić”.

By car

From Belgrade: Loznica is about 150 km away from Belgrade. From E-70 highway use Exit Ruma and follow direction Ruma-Šabac-Loznica.



When you get to Loznica, follow the road 330 and after 6 km you will arrive to Tršić.



Parking: There is a parking in front of the Educational and Cultural Centre “Vuk Karadžić” in Tršić.

By bus

Buses from Belgrade, as well as from Bosnia and Herzegovina, travel to Loznica every day. The main terminal is located 0.8 km from the city center, Svetog Save street bb, 15300 Loznica. For more information use contact +381 15 7882714 or visit the website <http://www.bas.rs/RedVoznje.aspx?lng=sl>

By airplane

If you travel by airplane, the nearest airport is Nikola Tesla International Airport in Belgrade, 18 km from the city centre. To get to the centre of Belgrade, you can use more possibilities:

- A1 Mini bus from airport to Slavija Square (ticket price is 300 RSD, travel 30 min.);
